Guide for approval of minigolf tournament courses worldwide

Update 25th January 2010

This guide is based on the decisions of the WMF Delegates Conference, the WMF Executive Committee and the WMF Technical Committee.

2

All minigolf courses worldwide, where are played minigolf tournaments within the organisation of WMF and the active members, have to be approved following the rules of this guide.

Each active member is responsible for the approval of all minigolf courses in the own territory and has hereby to guarantee a controlled tournament standard and to make sure, that the spirit of minigolf sport with fair and calculable conditions can take place on the base of a nationwide organisation.

For the approval procedure has to be used

- A the general approval form of WMF
- B the detailed form according to the system, which has to be approved (concrete, miniaturegolf, felt golf, MOS)

The filled and signed form is sent by the active member to the WMF Sport Director, who checks and confirms the approval under consideration of the actual sport rules as well as the homologation conditions and other specifications of WMF.

The sport director organizes, that an approval plate is sent to the approved course directly or through the national federation. The plate shows the WMF-logo, the term "approved course" and the validity date.

Courses, which have been built before 01.01.2006 have to be approved for tournaments latest until 31.12.2007.

Courses, which are built after 31.12.2005 have to be approved before the first minigolf tournament on this course.

For the approval procedure WMF charges the active member as follows:

A	For courses built before 31.12.2005:	25 Euro
B	For courses built since 01.01.2006:	250 Euro
C	Prolongation valid for 3 years more	10 Euro

The WMF sport office sends out the prolongation forms on purpose beginning of the year, where the validity expires.

The active members have to make sure, that they have taken all legal steps in consideration, that the data on the official forms can be stored and used for internal purposes by WMF and continental federations.

To implement these guide worldwide the WMF is entitled to declare a penalty fee of 25 Euro per not approved minigolf course per year.

The WMF board decided in the meeting at 24th – 25th March 2007 about a penalty fee for all tournaments on not-approved courses (valid as from January 1, 2008) as follows:
25 Euro penalty per national or international announced tournament per course
